

Market Outlook


The 12- and 24 - month strip prices increased from last week, settling at 4.254/Dth (up 5.82%) and 4.238/Dth (up 4.56%) respectively.


The June gas futures contract has seen a range of mid-\$3.20s to mid-\$3.70s as traders balance concerns over mild weather and more bullish supply-demand outlook heading into summer. Looking ahead through mid-June, prompt prices could come under renewed pressure from substantial injections over the next 4-6 weeks.

The EIA reported a 104 Bcf injection which is slightly higher than expectations of a 102 Bcf. Inventory is now 412 Bcf below last year and 30 Bcf above the 5-yr average.



The US Environmental Protection Agency is planning to end the Energy Star program, which recognizes the energy efficiency attributes of household appliances. The certification is also available for homes, commercial buildings and industrial facilities. Since its enactment, Energy Star has saved US consumers about \$500 billion through energy efficiency and prevented about 4 billion metric tons of greenhouse gas emissions, according to the program's website. The EPA estimated the reorganization could save American taxpayers \$300 million annually.
