

Market Outlook

The 12- and 24-month strip prices remained stable from last week, settling at \$3.696/Dth and \$3.802/Dth respectively.


Natural Gas cash prices have also remained relatively stable from last week. However, cash prices in the NY regions have jumped about 15% from this same time last year.


The EIA reported a 71 Bcf injection which is slightly higher than expectations of a 69 Bcf injection. Inventory is 38 Bcf below last year and 188 Bcf above the 5-yr average.



Oil prices have leveled off after a three-day rally amid increasing geopolitical tensions in Europe and the Middle East. The market has also been assessing President Trump's latest comments on possible measures on Russia, while the EU has vowed to increase sanctions after Russian drones entered Polish airspace.

The threat of disruption to supply is being balanced by bearish market fundamentals, with U.S. crude inventories rising last week.





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
